WAHATOYA STATE WILDLIFE AREA is a 200-acre open space with two lakes each with a 1-mile trail. Working in partnership with Colorado Parks and Wildlife since 2015, Volunteer Stewards have worked 582 hours on maintaining and grooming the trails and constructing steps at an in-kind value of \$14,080.

SCHOOL NATURE TRAIL is a restored .25-mile interpretative trail on 3-acres with information kiosks, plant identification signs, footbridges and benches that provides an outdoor space to learn about the natural environment. Volunteer Stewards have worked 942 hours on restoring and maintaining the trails at an in-kind value of \$22,122.

THE SPANISH PEAKS WILDERNESS AREA, consisting of 19,226 acres and 33 miles of trails, is managed by the U.S. Forest Service/San Carlos Ranger District through its field office in La Veta. The U.S. Forest Service and La Veta Trails formed the Spanish Peaks Wilderness Stewards to maintain the Wilderness trails. Since 2018, 26 Spanish Peaks Wilderness Stewards have worked 274 hours on maintenance and logging out fallen trees at an in-kind value of \$6,955.

FLOOD MITIGATION PROJECT - A COMMUNITY EFFORT

The Town of La Veta asked La Veta Trails to lead a volunteer effort to restore the Cucharas River channel following the Spring 2018 Fire, which burned 100,000+ acres leaving a huge scar that raised the prospect of significant flooding. It took 186 volunteers working 3,318 hours over 40 days to clear vegetation along 4,800 linear feet of the river, covering 8.7 acres of land area. An extraordinary effort on the part of people from La Veta, Cuchara, Walsenburg, Gardner and places in between.




